## Florida is a litany of near Democratic wins









- Nelson lost by 10,033 in FL; Would have won with increased Democratic turnout of 0.25 points.
- Gillum lost by 32,463 in FL; Would have won with increased Democratic turnout of 0.81 points.
- Clinton lost by 112,911 in FL; Would have won with increased Democratic turnout of 2.1 points.
- Gore lost the <u>Presidency</u> by 537 FL votes.





## Was VBM & total turnout higher in School Board District 3 & Palm Bay?

YES: Total turnout was 8.6 percentage points higher, and mail ballot turnout was 5.6 percentage points higher, in School Board District 3 than in areas of the County with no turnout activities orchestrated by BrevardDems. Total turnout was 4.3 percentage points higher in Palm Bay than in areas of the county not targeted by BrevardDems. In addition to differences in candidates and in voter base & demographics, we assume that greater performance in SB3 was due to significantly more voter contacts in that area, as shown in the chart below. It's unclear why Palm Bay mail ballot turnout was impacted so little by BrevardDems effort; we assume differences in district demographics, candidate, and lower rates of voter contact are to blame.
